

begin in *The Stone Technology Lab* and is also available for community use. *The Charles and Rose Hylton Library* is located in a former classroom and is open and free to the public. *The David Harrison Spencer Room* is a pretty room for small events and classes.

The 1927 wing renovation has been recently completed and dedicated in November 2007. This wing contains *The Louise Lester Banquet Hall*, a stage, complete with professional sound, lighting and curtains providing the ability for performances and other entertainment, a performer's "green room", a caterer's set up kitchen with basic equipment to keep food hot or cold, and an overflow room for coat check-in or appetizers. *The Stanley Bowles Room* has been restored to its 1927 state and will be unique not only for historical purposes but will also hold Spencer-Penn memorabilia and possibly a gift shop. The fifth classroom in this wing is undesignated and may be used for rentals or classes. All of these classrooms surround the large 1927 auditorium. *The Louise Lester Banquet Hall* is a beautiful room large enough to hold up to 175 sit-down dinner guests for receptions, concerts, dinner theater and large business meetings.

Spencer-Penn has come full circle beginning as a small rural school which quickly became the heart of the community while establishing a tradition of high education. Its life ended as a public school but has now been given another chance to continue its tradition of education and special events.
